

Our Mission

Keep It Movin' is a year-long churchbased walking program and research study designed to decrease chronic illness and improve the overall quality of life within the African American community.





An exercise program hosted by the Alive Faith Network and RUSH in partnership with churches throughout the Chicagoland area.

The Keep It Movin' research study is testing two approaches, GetFit4Life and Stronger4Longer, to empower communities to safely increase their daily physical activity for overall improved health.

GetFit4Life

We provide the tools needed to help participants make active lifestyle changes on their own schedules. The program at a glance:

The African American Firefighters & Paramedics League, in conjunction with the Chicago Fire Department is presenting "Firefighter 4 A Day" to give African American children the opportunity to see firefighting from a firefighter's point of view. This opportunity will familiarize young potential firefighters with some of the history, practices and procedures of fire departments.

Our goal is to give our community as well as our children a sense of direction and understanding as to what is required (such as education, commitment and pride) in order to be a Chicago Fire Department Firefighter. We realize that we can be very influential in a child's life not only by what we say, but by what we do. As a public relations event, we can maximize this opportunity to instill hope in these children that they too, could be fire fighters if they put forth the effort to do so. Parents and adults aged 18+ will be able to inquire and receive information about the process s to become a firefighter.

During "Firefighter 4 A Day", the children will get an understanding of what it is like to be a firefighter. There will be several activities geared toward familiarizing our children with the firefighter culture. This event will be held on Saturday, April 27, 2024 at the Quinn Fire Academy (558 W. 
